#### Title of Practice:-

Earn while Learn

#### **Objectives of the Practice:-**

"Holistic development of the youth builds tomorrow's Nation", the institute firmly adheres to this philosophy. The vision & mission of educating the masses lies in the creation of a society that is progressive, logical, and environment conscious. Academic content along with an appreciation of labor, physical work, the culture of work, and the value of money needs to be imbibed in the next generation. The objective motivates the institute to start a scheme "Earn while Learn" for the students to make at least some of them, a resource for the Nation.

#### The Context:-

The students of the institution belong to semi-urban areas, near Nagpur City. The family resources are limited in both academic & financial background. The peer life of Metro City, observed by these students raises a negative mindset about what they have. Another part is to be compatible with job opportunities or self-employment through work experience after graduation. The "Earn while Learn" scheme caters to this gap and enables the participating students to unleash the power of concurrent learning and earning. The scheme is aimed at boosting confidence and serving the needy.

#### The Practice:-

The scheme is explained at the start of the year along with experience sharing of beneficiated students. The areas of experience include document identification and verification, computer work in MS Office (Excel, Word), Data entry in various portals, and interactive teamwork. The applications are invited from the students and scrutinized for work area compatibility. Working hours, task timing, remuneration, and responsibilities are clearly explained to the students, and on the consent they are involved in :

Data Entry	- in the library, Examination forms, Enrolment form

The selected students work under the supervision of staff members and get training for assigned jobs before they work. Feedback on working is provided for improvisation, and

betterment and is appreciated in programs to create a positive environment. At the end of the task, an experience-sharing session is organized.

#### **Evidence of Success:-**

Participation of around 100+ students in last 5 years, stands as major success for the work experience and students inclination. The scheme's student participation rate is calculated based on the number of non-teaching staff members. After the experience of work, it is found that participant is well versed in computer operation, can find photocopies & originals, and understand the importance of documents and how to keep them safe which makes them future-ready. On receiving participants' views our belief that education should not be a distant pursuit but a dynamic experience interwoven with real-world opportunities has become stronger. The rise in the level of confidence bridges the gap between semi-urban & metro peers.

#### **Problems Encountered and Resources Required:-**

The main challenge we face is the limited time available to complete tasks. We address this by working extra hours and including working holidays. Another initial issue is obtaining parental consent for students to stay longer at the institute. Parents often feel that it is an unnecessary activity, but they appreciate it once it's completed. To enroll more students in this program, we need a larger digital infrastructure.

#### Notes:-

In the last 5 years working 500+ hours and a total remuneration of Rs.1,00,000/- has made this scheme consistent & best practice.

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#### Title: Community service programs through the National Service Scheme (NSS)

#### **Objective of the Practice:**

The National Service Scheme (N.S.S.) has a motto of "Not me But you". Our institution believes in this motto and strives to make students aware of their social responsibility while they receive their regular education. The main objective of this initiative is to develop a positive attitude towards society among students, and to encourage them to be responsible for the well-being of their community. Through organized community service programs, the institution aims to go beyond academic learning and transform students into active and socially conscious contributors to society.

#### **Context of the Practice:**

The college actively involved in community service programs organized by the NSS on yearly basis. These programs are designed to cater to the specific needs of the local community, and the college involves its students in a variety of activities as part of this initiative. This approach promotes the overall development of the students and instills in them a sense of social responsibility.

Students visit nearby villages and participate in labor camps to assist with tasks such as construction, repair, and maintenance of community assets. They also participate in cleanliness drives, working towards making the villages cleaner and more hygienic. #### The Practice:

Our N.S.S. unit regularly conducts NSS Camps for 7 days every year in nearby villages, conducts awareness campaigns, cleanliness drives, environment awareness program, Shram dan, and Blood donation Camps. Through this student gain skills in mobilizing community participation and develop the competence required for group living and sharing of responsibilities. Through such activities, students used to understand the true meaning of higher education.

The College conducted a National Service Scheme (NSS) camp, spanning from March 25th to March 31st, 2021, in Bhansali Takli Village, District Nagpur. The NSS camp's objective was

to promote community service, socio-economic development, and awareness-raising activities among the local population.

The opening ceremony, on March 25th, 2021, saw the presence of distinguished individuals from the village. Dr. Archana Patki, Program Officer for the NSS Unit of Ram Krishna Wagh College, presented the camp's vision and mission. The program continued with speeches from the guests present at the ceremony, and it concluded with a recital of Vande Mataram.

The NSS camp's activities included cleaning up the village's surroundings, planting trees, constructing a bridge, conducting cultural events, and promoting waste management and recycling practices. NSS volunteers also collected information from villagers through surveys to improve the village's sanitary facilities.

The volunteers encouraged villagers to work together to keep their surroundings clean, conducted yoga sessions and workshops for good health and hygiene and taught children about the importance of maintaining personal hygiene and social norms.

Overall, the NSS camp was a successful endeavor in promoting community service and awareness-raising activities among the local population of Bhansali Takli Village.

#### **Evidences of the Practice:**

Our N.S.S. unit always use to aware the students and community through scientific way e.g. students made aware that how blood donation is safe and one can donate blood by following certain rules. Our college very proudly like to says that in last 11 (eleven) years total 826 students donated blood out of which 285 were girl students through 18 blood donation camps. Our institute regularly conducts NSS camps nearby villages. In last 5 years, 5 camps were organized and total 4828 people were beneficiaries, out of which 241patients treated with free cataract surgeries and 231 free spectacles were distributed to needy people. Through environmental awareness program our volunteers every year work hard during Our volunteer's make aware the people regarding importance of clean water, clean environment and green mother earth.

#### Impact:

This practice has positively impacted students by exposing them to societal challenges and encouraging empathy. It has deepened their understanding of societal issues, instilled a sense of civic responsibility, and helped them acquire valuable life skills. The initiative has also led to increased community engagement and personal growth among students, with alumni continuing to be involved in social initiatives.

The college organized a rally on pollution prevention inside the campus and also in the surrounding premise.


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## NSS Camp Report 7<sup>th</sup> Feb 2020 – 14<sup>th</sup> Feb 2020


